



**KEIZER TRAFFIC SAFETY COMMISSION

1. CALL TO ORDER

Steve Prothero called the meeting to order at 7:10 p.m.

3. APPROVAL OF MINUTES ~ Woody Richter moved to approve the May 2007

Minutes. Charles Hoffer seconded. Motion passed as follows: Hoffer, Prothero, Trevizo and Richter in favor with Jackson abstaining and Rios and Blake absent. (Chair Rios joined the meeting immediately following the approval of Minutes.)

4. APPEARANCE OF INTERESTED CITIZENS ~ *John Avery* the neighborhood watch

coordinator residing on Sunset, voiced concern about speeding cars on Sunset. He noted that they were often going what looked like 40 miles per hour and that on one occasion a vehicle had crashed through the fence at Sunset Park at the end of the street. He requested that the computer plates be placed on the street to verify the speeds. Officer Wenning replied that the plates are broken at this time and, because the manufacture is no longer in business, there is little probability that they will be repaired. He added that he would pass the information on to Officers Kelly and Zuniga who will be on the shift in August so they can monitor the area. He suggested that Mr. Avery encourage his neighbors to write down the license plates of speeding vehicles and give that information to the Police Department so that they can contact the owners of the vehicles and urge them to slow down. He added that Public Works has pneumatic lines that will monitor traffic. Chair Rios interjected that he would request Public Works to place them on Sunset. Councilor McKane added that he might be able to find a place to get the broken plates serviced or replaced.

5. DETERMINATION OF REPRESENTATIVE TO RRR ADVISORY COMMITTEE ~

David Rios volunteered to attend the August RRR meeting.

6. OLD/NEW BUSINESS

Chemawa/Ridge Intersection ~ The stop sign is down and traffic seems to be flowing well.

U-Turn at Chemawa/Lockhaven ~ The No U-Turn sign is in place at the intersection.

ODOT Grant ~ Chair Rios noted that because the grant requests need to be in by July 31 it was too late to submit one this year, but he hoped the Commission would be prepared to submit one next year.

Additional discussion took place regarding Tepper undercrossing and the Ulali Drive bike path.

7. TECHNICAL ADVISORY COMMITTEE – TRANSPORTATION SYSTEM PLAN UPDATE

~ Steve Prothero agreed to serve as the primary representative with David Rios serving as alternate. Randy Jackson suggested incorporating the sidewalk inventory into the TSP.
