Keizer Bicycle Advisory Committee
Wednesday June 20, 2001
MINUTES

The Meeting was called to order by Hersch Sangster. Minutes from last month were reviewed and approved. Correction were made to the minutes to reflect that the helmets in the parks was 6/16 not 6/15.

The KBAC has been asked to help with the Keizer Police to set-up and run a bicycle skills fair on 7/7 1-4 p.m. at Volcano Stadium. Hersch and any other member available will attend.

Joe talked about the Act grant and our helmets. Joe will be again placing an order. Over 175 Helmets have been given away to kids at the Skate Park and at Safety Fairs this last month. Hersch will try to get some helmets for the Volcano event 7/7. The next helmet fair will be on 8/18 at Skate Park. Judy pointed out that the City Council would like to see members of the Committee at our events. As reported at the last meeting, the Council approved the Skate Park helmet rules. They will be approving the total Park rules that will include the helmet requirement. The signage for the rule should be up soon.

Discussion on the need for a multi-use path and bridge at Hidden Creek /Country Glen park for the future. Overlays are planned on Chemawa up to Kinglet, which will include bike lanes. Alder, under the new construction will include bike lanes. Plans for Dearborn later this year include bike lanes.

Judy Smith had children and adults from Keizer Elementary participate in the Parade this year. It went well, safety stickers were given out. KBAC plans on doing it again next year.

Joe has received a request for input on the development of a new bike map. Last one was in 1995. The Committee reviewed the Keizer area and gave input on the new areas that should be included.

The City took care of the misuse of the bike rack at Papa John. Hersch is still waiting e-mail about new construction enforcement and has asked about standards for racks.

David had question about speed and crossing issues on Lockhaven at the last meeting. Public Works was contacted about traffic calming that might work in the area including crossing. The City Engineer has recommended against any mid-block crossings as calming devices.

The last Traffic Safety meeting was cancelled. Barry will attend the June meeting.
